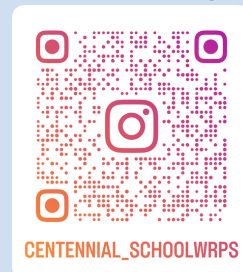

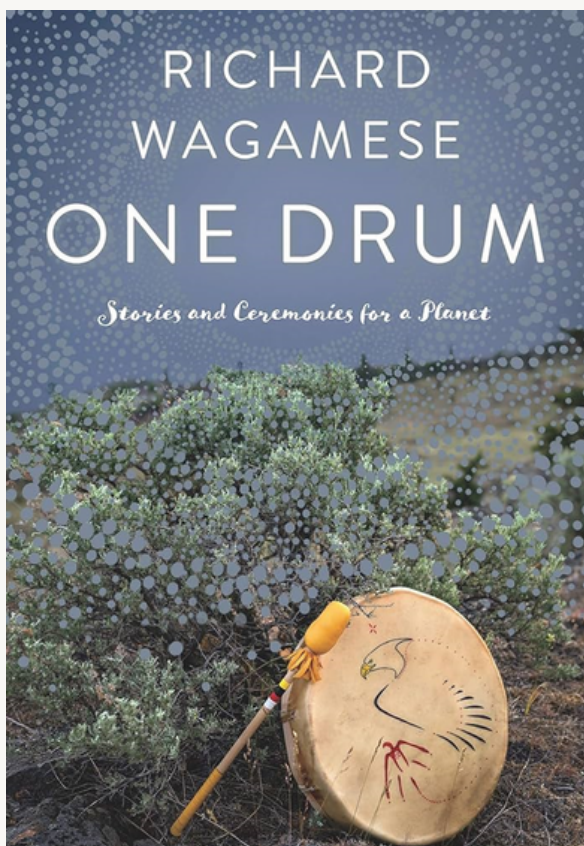

Lance Scout - One Drum Teachings

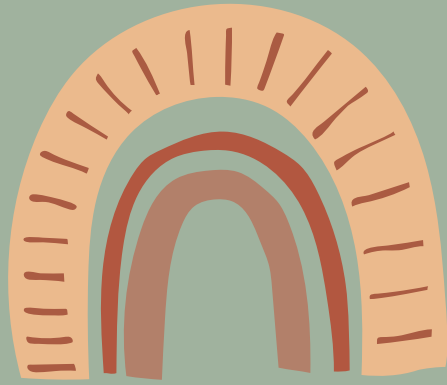

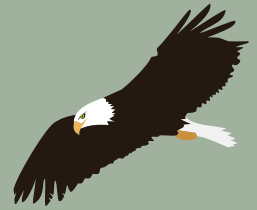
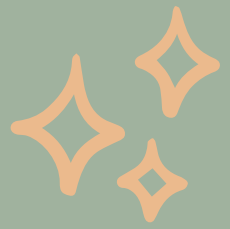
Indigenous Ways of Knowing are explored and embraced in this project which highlights the worldviews and understandings of Indigenous peoples on Turtle Island. Students gain an understanding of their own lived experiences through self-exploratory discussions and creative, practical and collaborative assignments that reflect the student's heritage. Taught in a traditional circle space reflecting the earth, stars, moons and our life cycle promoting equality and belonging.

Our first lesson is "The Sacred Breath" with the guiding questions of 'Who is Creator? What is Creation?'

Friendly reminder to all parents that the second round of student surveys for our Integrated School Supports Program (ISSP) will begin in May.

What is this study about?

The ISSP is an early intervention and prevention initiative that is intended to provide essential services to address a variety of needs in diverse elementary schools. It aims to provide wraparound school supports which may include a positive police presence, on-site mental health worker, physical education teacher, social, access to a health clinician, breakfast and lunch programs, and after-school programs. We want to evaluate how well this program is working and we are asking you to help us by taking part in this study.

For those who have previously consented for your child to complete surveys for the ISSP program. This is a friendly reminder that your child will be completing the survey (e.g., social emotional wellbeing, school climate, and resilience) in the next two weeks.

What are we asking from students?

2x/year survey (~20 minutes)

- o Social emotional wellbeing
- o School climate
- o Resilience

Access to reading screeners your child completed at school.

Are there any risks to participating?

Minimal risk; possibly mild fatigue or emotional stress from completing surveys.

What are the benefits of participating?

- Understanding how well this program is serving your child's school.
- Having a voice in the programming as the information collected about the program will be used to inform future improvements.
